*For a day in your courts is better  
than a thousand elsewhere.  
I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God  
than live in the tents of wickedness.  
For the Lord God is a sun and shield;  
he bestows favour and honour.  
No good thing does the Lord withhold  
from those who walk uprightly.  
O Lord of hosts,  
happy is everyone who trusts in you." Psalm 84: 3,4,10-12.*

These verses, from our psalm appointed for today, will be familiar to many of us and we may have even joked about being a "doorkeeper in the house of my God". For most of you reading this you have spent a lot of time in Church, one way or another. Not just attending worship services but also at meetings, fundraisers, outreach projects, or maybe altar guild duties, property maintenance and the list goes on. I suspect that during this pandemic, with the restrictions around gathering, you have missed being involved in the Church community with others. I never thought I would say that I actually miss the Parish Meetings but it is true. I suspect it is just being with other friends and like-minded folk to do the "work of the Church". Why is it that the psalmist declares, "For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere"? I suspect that this ancient author experienced the joy of doing something that we believe, not only, benefits ourselves, but also serves God and the neighbour that God calls us to love.

Yesterday here in Pt Dover where I live, the local Probus group offered a socially distanced lemonade event outside on the lawn of St. Paul's Anglican Church the first public gathering of this group in over a year. The folks who attended experienced a real joy in seeing each other again after so long apart. They appreciated that the Church had provided a pleasant and safe place outside for them to gather. This is just one small example of the differences that a local Church can make simply by being there and open to the community.

One of my parishes after retirement was All Saints, Hagersville, and now as I drive past and see the For Sale sign, my heart always feels sad to think that this small but active community is no longer there. I remember not only the worship services, but also the Lenten lunches, community plant sales and other activities that took place there. I write this not to complain about the economic and social realities that are forcing so many of our Churches to close, but to point out that we are very blessed in Long Point Bay Parish to have found a creative way for three of our "village churches" to remain open and serving the community by working together. This pandemic has changed the way many of us view the life and work of the Church, and on-line services are probably part of our continuing outreach, however we are looking forward to seeing the Parish Churches back, serving their members but also the communities. We curse our buildings at times but they can be a great asset for ministry if we use them wisely. And so we say with the psalmist, "Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise."

The choir will continue into the 2022 year with more opportunities to perform and maybe make a recording!

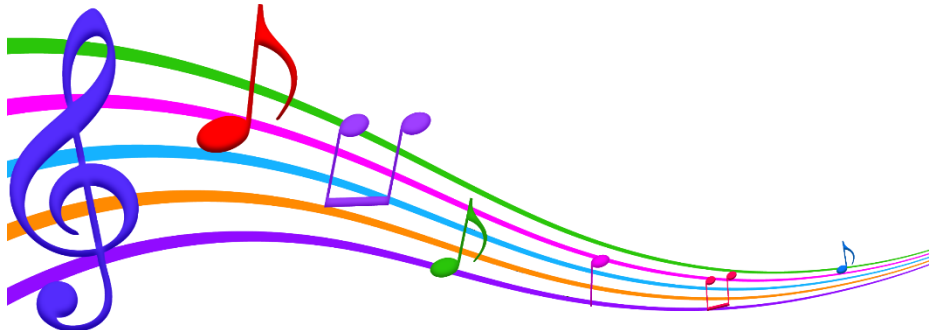
