## **Opening**

## **Readings**

ISAIAH 62:1-5;

PSALM 36:5-10;

1 CORINTHIANS 12:1-11;

JOHN 2:1-11

It's very difficult to preach from the Gospel of John at Christmastime. It's actually very easy to preach it in the season that follows the Epiphany. There is, you might have noticed, no story of Jesus' birth in the fourth Gospel. John does not tell you about an angel and Mary, about angelic choirs proclaiming the good news to shepherds, or even, for that matter, about the visit of the magi and their lavish gifts. Instead, John begins his story by revealing something about who this Jesus really is. We are meant to hear this news and rejoice. This is good news. Because the same God who formed you and the whole of creation, who spoke life and earth, sea and sky into being, now walks the earth, sent by the father, on a mission of love. We read about that just a few weeks ago. This week's Gospel, too, tells us good news about this son of God who lives among us. And it's surprising news. Our story, about Jesus at a wedding in Cana, is the first thing "the word" does that could be considered ministry. We find out who Jesus is in the beginning of the first chapter, he chooses some disciples in the second half. Then, he and his newly minted disciples go to a wedding. There Jesus, perhaps a little prematurely for his own sensibilities, shows us what the son of God is about, what it means to be word incarnate, born for our salvation. And he saves a wedding. He saves a feast. It was supposed to be a joyous occasion. Until the wine ran out. That was not good news. Feasts are not austere; the celebration of wedded love is not to be tempered by want or lack. So, Jesus, at his mother's insistence, made enough wine to last, good wine, even better wine than what they were already enjoying, and he made it miraculously out of water. Jesus' first act as a working messiah was to keep a wedding feast joyful. Because that is exactly what Jesus is like. Jesus' whole ministry was not like that.

As you well know, the Jesus' ministry was not all feasts and wine. There was real trial and temptation, doubt and sorrow. And before there was a resurrection, there was a cross. But the whole ministry of Jesus, whether it is accepted joyfully or scorned in anger, is an invitation to the kingdom of God. And that kingdom is joyful, and it is good. This story offers a glimpse of what is to come when all sufferings have been redeemed and the kingdom of God has been perfected here on earth, as it already is in heaven. The story of a redeemed wedding feast in Cana, so many years ago invites you and I to rejoice in the unbound joy of the love of God, and to the wedding feast that awaits all who are found in Christ. Whatever else we see, let's not lose sight of what is good, true, and full of everlasting joy.
