You might have noticed that there is something a little off about what we Christians call good and true. We say strange things. We think strange things. We believe some very strange things. The Christian pattern is not so easily explained. And so, in some effort to explain what's different, we turn to the Saint Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. In answer to the question "what's up with you, Christians?" Paul answers, "well, we live by faith, and not by sight." And he's right. It takes a certain kind of faith to say that the first are last, and to cast all one's hope on the result. It takes another kind of faith to pass by seven apparently strong, capable leaders and pick the runt of the lot; a shepherd named David. Perhaps, most of all, it takes all the faith that we can muster to trust in the God of the cross, the God who decided that dying brings victory over sin and death. But it worked. Every time. In each of the last, we find the unadulterated image of God-the-servant. In David, we find the ancient type upon whom Israel's messianic hope was built. In the cross we find victory over death, and eternal life in Jesus' resurrection. These unnatural choices, these runts and deaths and all the odd choices are, in fact, like the mustard seed. The unlikeliest of things, the things that go unnoticed, end up growing and spreading their branches, giving life to all who depend on them. Each of these things is deceptive in its simplicity or, in the case of the cross, in its sheer horror. None of these, by sight, represents a particularly hopeful foundation. But, in the Kingdom of God, the first are last and the dead will live forever. Because in the Kingdom of God, we see hope in mustard seeds, small farmhands, and a Roman cross. In short; we live by faith, and not by sight.

Bishop Todd Townshend has accepted the request of **The Reverend Canon Bryan Girling** to retire effective November 1, 2021 with his last Sunday in his parish October 1, 2021.

Canon Bryan was ordained a deacon May 17, 1989 and priested November 30, 1989. He has served the parishes of St. John's, Port Rowan with St. Luke's, Vienna, Trinity Church, Port Burwell, St. Williams, St. Williams; St. James, Brantford and Church of the Epiphany Kingsville, the position from which he will retire. He has served on Diocesan Council, the Administration and Finance Committee, the Budget Sub-Committee and as Regional Dean of Brant, Brant/Norfolk and Essex. He was named a Canon of the Cathedral on May 26, 2013.

Canon Bryan will be honoured with the other retirees at Synod 2022.

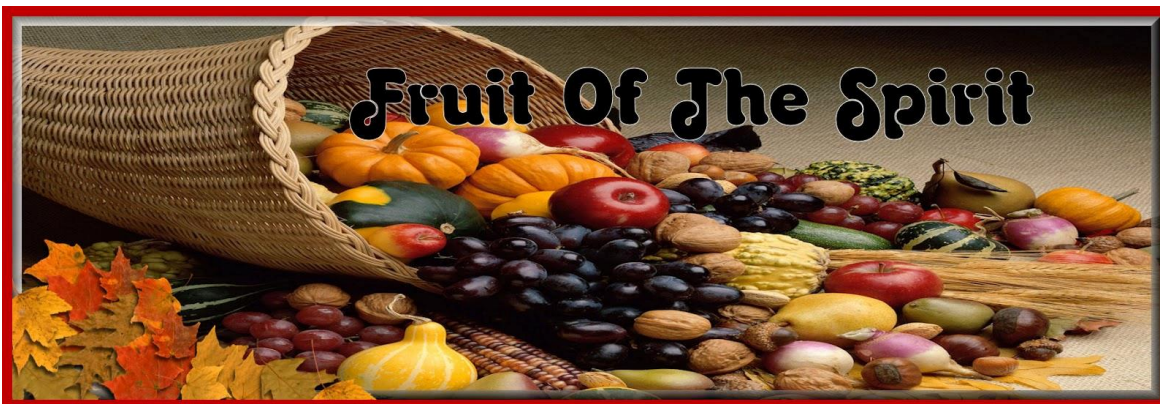
