## Reflection for Sunday February 20th from Rev. Jack Cox

Let me begin the reflection for this Sunday (Feb 20<sup>th</sup>) by asking you this question: Where will God be on Sunday, Feb 20<sup>th</sup>? The simple answer is, Where ever you are! Now I'm willing to bet not a single one of all of us would have come up with that answer. But I believe that is the experiential truth. Now why in the world would I say that?

Go to the 1st reading for this Sunday (Genesis 45:3-11), and recall the background to this reading. Joseph's brothers were really jealous of the special relationship Joseph had with his father. So, to eliminate Joseph and that relationship (which really stuck in their craws) they had sold their brother into slavery. That would be the end of 'goody two shoes' Joseph. But you all will remember how Joseph, in Egypt, rose to a position of power and influence. When famine forced Jacob's sons to go to Egypt seeking life saving food, they encounter Joseph but don't recognize him.

At this point in the story, it could have played out in any number of ways. One of the options (which I would have thought least likely) is that Joseph, without revealing who he is to his brothers, has them go back and bring their father back with them. When the brothers return with Jacob, their father, Joseph reveals himself to them, and graciously sets them up in Egypt.

It was Joseph's trust in God that made him who he was. It was Joseph's relationship with God that moved him to forgive his brothers, to bring his family to Egypt, and enable them to prosper when the world around them was starving.

Was God present in that experience? My answer would be, Yes, Certainly! How was God present and acting? In and through Joseph.

So back to my question about God's presence on Sunday Feb 20<sup>th</sup>. That presence, the presence of God, will depend on you and me and the choices we make. If I act like a jerk on the 20<sup>th</sup>, will God be absent? Theoretically no, but experientially? Probably.

All of this is simply to say that what we say, how we say it, what we do or don't do has the very real possibility of making God more (or less) present, more (or less) patient, more (or less) loving. Our choices will very really impact how, and even if, God is experienced.

And the Word becomes flesh, and lives among us!
