Reflection for Sunday January 2nd from Fr. Enrique

Today's Gospel should fill us with immense joy. A few weeks ago, we talked about how the love of God in the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ brought us Joy and that spread to all who listened to the message of the Virgin Mary. Matthew shows us that the three wise men *“went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy.”* Matthew 2: 10 The Evangelist wants us to focus on the joy that fills us when we receive the message of the birth of our savior.

Joy goes hand in hand with the faith that these wise men from distant lands show a King Herod who was, full of selfishness. God sends these messengers not only to worship his beloved son, Jesus Christ, but to reach the people of Israel represented by their king and who is invited to worship the king of kings and Lord of Lords, but instead this king and many of his people would prefer to kill Him, to destroy every trace of God's love for humanity.

The three wise men had faith and knew how to discover in the brightness of that tiny star, which at times eluded them, the passage of God through their lives. It is that, which is necessary to have very clean inner ears to hear the voice of God. King Herod, through these wise men, also received an invitation from God to join those who would worship the Child. But the inner garbage and the selfishness and the noise of the power accumulated in his ears, did not allow him to listen. He stayed in his palace with all his earthly riches and filled his soul with hatred; which filled his soul with filth. including all those who supported him.

Jesus may be a little child, but we learn what Matthew wants to reveal to us in his gospel, God was in charge of his Son's life and of all those who would dispose of his life so that God's love reaches each and every one of his children who seek him.

The gospel tells us that the star came to stand on top of where the child was. Therefore, the wise men, seeing the star, were filled with immense joy. Today more than ever in a world full of countless problems, global warming, a pandemic that seems to never end but that ends up filling us with uncertainties, fears, sadness, distrust, and that takes us away from all that we want and from those we love be near. But at the same time, it makes us think that one day we will be together to love each other and thus that love of God in Our Lord Jesus Christ will enliven all creation again.

Let us also receive with that immense joy and much faith in our hearts this announcement of salvation that shines despite all the dark and difficult moments that humanity is experiencing. It is the same joy that the Virgin Mary brought in the Visits Elizabeth and that was transmitted to Zechariah and later to many more who shared this first announcement of the Gospel of Salvation. It is the same joy that the angels announce to the shepherds and that they themselves felt when they proclaimed *“suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!”* Luke 2: 13

Let us worship with the Magi, give glory to the shepherds, dance with the angels, because today a Savior has been born: the Messiah, the Lord. The Lord is God: He illuminates us, and fills our lives with the heavenly light that the Father has sent to all humanity, so that they may live the warmth of God's love.

This is a great feast, which we celebrate today as the Church of Christ, as the body of the Savior. Epiphany is the day of gifts.

Christ received splendid gifts and shows us how to offer our gifts to God. Saint Augustine says that the Magi brought him gold as a king; incense as God; myrrh as a man.

This offering can also have another Spiritual meaning. According to Solomon, gold means heavenly wisdom: «[Precious treasure remains in the house of the wise,](#) » [Proverbs 21:20](#) According to the psalmist, incense is a symbol of pure prayer: « [Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice](#) » (Psalm 141,2). Because if our prayer is pure, it makes a perfume purer than the aroma of incense reach God; And in the same way that this aroma rises to heaven, so our prayer also reaches God. Myrrh symbolizes the mortification of our flesh. Thus, we offer gold to the Lord when we shine before him in the light of heavenly wisdom. We offer incense to him when we direct a pure prayer to him. And myrrh, for abstinence « [And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.](#) » (Galatians 5:24), and we carry the cross-following Jesus.

Today we are called to live the joy of salvation proclaimed to all of us by these wise men, by the angels, by the Virgin Mary and all those who announce the good news of God's love.

Let us never say that we do not have something very great to give him, to offer him to God. Let's never think that our life is full like Herod's and we don't need to worship our Savior; We must understand that there is greater joy in giving than in receiving and that is what God offers us today the opportunity to offer as an offering, as a pleasant sacrifice “[The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.](#)” [Psalm 51:17](#)

We are called to receive this great joy, that we were overwhelmed with joy in our hearts, but by keeping it to ourselves, we will be doing the same as King Herod. We, as living children of God, and brothers through the blood of Christ, our Savior to carry, to donate this joy to all our brothers, and all those who are far from God's love and who many times feel full of many material things. However, it is just a void empty of God's love that ends up causing a lot of harm to themselves.

May God bless you today and always. And may this new year be filled with many blessings to you and your entire family.


For the week beginning 2 January 2022, we will be praying for the **Rev. Rosalyn Elm** and the people of the Parish of the Six Nations.
