#### Reflection for Maundy Thursday from AD Rick Jones

Today is the beginning of the three days in Holy Week called the Triduum, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. These are the last days of Jesus life, death and new life. This is Jesus' last night of freedom with his disciples. He knows that this will be the night of his arrest and we can only imagine that this is really a significant time, during which he is going to impress on them the most important teachings.

So, what happens? As was his way Jesus likes to teach over a meal. Using the bread and wine, he shows them a ritual with prayers that gives thanks for his life and teaching. We call it the Holy Eucharist (Thanksgiving) and then he gives them a New Commandment, "That you love one another, as I have loved you." John 13:34 This seems a bit strange because, as devout Jews, they already have the Great Commandment, "to love God and their neighbours as themselves." Why is Jesus saying this is something New? I think he is trying to make this commandment real by restating it in terms of his own life and actions. Abstract ideas are great but real person doing something is always more compelling. "Love each other AS I HAVE loved you." For the rest of his time with them he will be SHOWING them what that love looks like when applied in the real world and in the worst of situations.

He illustrates what his love looks like, the essence of his teaching. He washes his disciple's feet, as a servant, not lording it over them but serving them. This is another parable that he is acting out. If you want to love you must be willing to serve, to put the needs of others ahead of your own. This truly doesn't come naturally for us, and is another one of Jesus' seemingly impossible demands, like loving our neighbours and even our enemies! Yet here it is folks; this is Jesus last real message to his followers.

Jesus will now in the last hours of his life act out this commandment and show the world the power of love and acceptance even unto death. No where in scripture can we find that God wanted, or needed Jesus to die, especially as some kind of blood sacrifice to atone for sin. This is, and always was, a complete distortion of Jesus "sacrifice". Rome and the religious elite chose to put Jesus to death for their own reasons. Jesus, by not meeting violence with violence, shows the power of unconditional love, even of our enemies! Violence always begets violence, even when people think that if they can only scapegoat someone that they fear or hate, they will somehow be better or happier or safer. This is a story as old as time, and it continues in the retaliatory violence, social tribalism, and racism of our own time acted out on CNN or the CBC. Jesus acts out the unconditional love of nonviolence and for a moment Rome and the Religious elite think they have won. But the ultimate lesson of Easter is that the unconditional love shown by Jesus, and by God, will always be the most powerful force in life. We will see this drama unfold over the next two days but I am challenging you to forget about what you think you know about Good Friday and Easter and look at the story from Jesus' point of view, the view that embodies actions of unconditional love.
