Dear friends,

With the return to our diocesan **RED Stage** of our Loving our Neighbours frame work, here are a few reminders of the **RED Stage** requirements. The full document may be accessed using the link below.

Parishes are prohibited from regular in-person worship within the church building.

No more than three (3) persons may be present when filming or live-streaming a service. This includes any person running the AV equipment. If necessary, a parish may apply in writing to their Territorial Archdeacon for permission to have up to two (2) other persons present for filming or live-streaming. This request should explain why the extra person or persons are required as well outlining where each of the persons will be during the service. If a parish has received such permission during a previous shutdown, that permission is still valid.

Parishes may hold outdoor in-person worship. The numbers at such gatherings may not exceed 50 or the number that may be safely physically distanced, whichever is less.

Indoor weddings or funerals may be held with a maximum of 10 persons present. (This number does not include funeral home staff.) This maximum also applies to funerals held in funeral homes.

Outdoor or graveside funerals or interments may be conducted with no more than 50 people or the number that may be safely physically distanced, whichever is less.

Outdoor weddings may be conducted with no more than 10 people present including the officiant, wedding planners, photographers, videographers and other staff. Outdoor weddings require prior approval from the Bishop.

Baptisms are allowed only in extraordinary circumstances with the prior approval of the Bishop.


Food sustainability ministries and 12-step meetings may continue to take place in our buildings. 12-step meetings are limited to 10 persons per meeting.

We are grateful that more and more people are being vaccinated as the vaccine roll-out continues. Please remember that all safety protocols are still to be followed.

THE CROWN



The Crown is a historical drama streaming television series about the reign of Queen Elizabeth II, created and principally written by Peter Morgan, and produced by Left Bank Pictures and Sony Pictures Television for Netflix. Morgan developed it from his drama film *The Queen* (2006) and especially his stage play *The Audience* (2013). The first season covers the period from Elizabeth's marriage to Philip, Duke of Edinburgh in 1947 to the disintegration of her sister Princess Margaret's engagement to Group Captain Peter Townsend in 1955. The second season covers the period from the Suez Crisis in 1956 to the retirement of Prime Minister Harold Macmillan in 1963 and the birth of Prince Edward in 1964. The third season spans 1964 to 1977, includes Harold Wilson's two periods as prime minister, and introduces Camilla Shand. The fourth season spans 1979 to the early 1990s and includes Margaret Thatcher's tenure as prime minister and Lady Diana Spencer's marriage to Prince Charles. The fifth and sixth seasons, which will close the series, will cover the Queen's reign into the 21st century.



This week in history

1598 King [Henry IV](#) of France promulgated the [Edict of Nantes](#) in Brittany, granting a large measure of religious liberty to his Protestant subjects, the [Huguenots](#).

1606 The Union Flag, precursor to the [Union Jack](#), was adopted as the national flag of Great Britain.

1865 On April 14th in 1865, just after the effective end of the [American Civil War](#), U.S. Pres. [Abraham Lincoln](#) was [shot](#) by [John Wilkes Booth](#) while attending a production at Ford's Theatre in Washington, D.C., and died the next morning.

1892 A [patent](#) for the first portable [typewriter](#) was issued in the United States.

Maple Cinnamon Rolls



Ingredients

1 cup buttermilk
 1 pkg dry active yeast (8g)
 1 ½ quarts all-purpose flour, plus extra for surface dusting
 1 tsp ground nutmeg
 ½ tsp salt
 ½ cup pure maple syrup
 ⅔ tbsp maple extract
 2 eggs
 ½ cup unsalted butter, softened and divided

Filling

½ cup brown sugar
 1 tbsp ground cinnamon

Maple Icing

1 pkg. (250 g/8 oz) plain cream cheese, softened
 ½ cup icing sugar, sifted
 ⅓ cup pure maple syrup

Instructions

Dough: In microwavable measuring cup, warm buttermilk (100°F/38°C). Sprinkle yeast over top of milk; let stand for 10 minutes or until frothy.

In a stand mixer with the paddle attachment, stir together flour, nutmeg and salt. On low speed, quickly add buttermilk mixture, maple syrup, maple extract, eggs and ¼ cup of the butter. Increase speed to medium and beat until ingredients are thoroughly combined, about 2 minutes. Switch to the dough hook attachment and knead on medium-high speed until dough is slightly sticky, smooth and comes away from sides of bowl, 2 to 5 minutes. If you find the dough is sticking to the sides of the mixer gently push dough towards the centre.

Turn dough onto lightly floured surface and knead by hand for 5 minutes until smooth and elastic. Place in lightly greased large bowl, turning to grease all over. Cover with plastic wrap and a tea towel. Let rise in warm place for 1 hour or until doubled in size and impressions remain when fingertips are pressed into dough.

Filling: In a small bowl, stir together sugar and cinnamon; set aside.

Lightly butter 13 x 9-inch (33 x 23 cm) glass baking dish.

Turn dough out onto lightly floured surface. Using a flour-dusted rolling pin, roll out into 12 x 15-inch (30 x 38 cm) rectangle (about ½-inch/1 cm thick).

Evenly spread remaining ¼ cup (60 mL) of butter over dough and sprinkle with sugar mixture. Starting at the long side, tightly roll up into a log. Cut into 8 slices. Place, cut sides down, in prepared dish, leaving space for dough to rise. Cover with plastic wrap and a tea towel; let rise in a warm place for 30 minutes or until doubled in size.

Preheat oven to 350°F (180°C).

Bake for 30 to 35 minutes until lightly golden. Let cool until warm.

Maple Icing: In a medium bowl, using an electric mixer, beat cream cheese, icing sugar and maple syrup until smooth.

Evenly spread each bun with maple icing while warm.

Tip: If you do not have buttermilk, add 1 tbsp (15 mL) white vinegar or fresh lemon juice to a 1 cup (250 mL) glass measuring cup. Add milk to the 1 cup (250 mL) line; stir and let stand 10 minutes.

Tip: If you do not have the pre-packaged yeast, you will require 2 ¼ tsp (11 mL) of yeast.

Tip: Ensure all ingredients are at room temperature.

Tip: Punch up the maple flavour and use very dark or dark maple syrup.

Tip: If you do not have a stand mixer, knead dough until smooth and elastic, about 7 to 8 minutes.
