‘Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego... neither serve your gods nor worship the image of gold you have set up.’

Daniel 3:12

There are two kinds of power on display in this story: the power of domination, and the power of God’s dominion.

The Babylonian empire was a symbol of domination. The wealth and excess of the royal court was built off the back of military conquests – the vulnerable trodden upon so that the powerful could rise higher. The golden gods that the king had made were a dazzling representation of this. But these three Jews refused to bow down.

Due to the ever-present threat of COVID-19 in our area. It has been decided to suspend all church services immediately, until further notice.







This week in history

1521- Portuguese navigator Ferdinand Magellan was killed during a fight with inhabitants of Mactan Island, Philippines.

1607 -The first permanent English settlers in North America landed at Cape Henry, Chesapeake Bay, and they later formed Jamestown.

1789 - Captain William Bligh of the British ship Bounty and 18 of his men were set adrift by mutinous sailors led by the master's mate Fletcher Christian.

1859 - Construction of the Suez Canal officially began; completed 10 years later, the waterway connected the Mediterranean and Red seas.

1898 - Spain declared war on the United States.

1992 - Riots erupted in Los Angeles in response to the verdict of a highly publicized trial of four white Los Angeles police officers who were acquitted of charges related to the 1991 beating of Rodney King, a black motorist who had resisted arrest.

Taste & See

Cherry - Rhubarb Cobbler



Ingredients

1 can cherry pie filling, OR frozen cherries add 4 tbsp corn starch and 1 cup sugar
3 cups chopped rhubarb, or other fruit
1 cup sugar
4 tbsp butter
Crust:
1/2 c butter
1 cup sugar
1 egg
1 cup flour
1 tsp baking powder
1/2 cup milk

Instructions

Spread fruit in a 13x9 baking pan. Sprinkle with sugar and dot with butter.

For Crust: cream butter and sugar in a mixing bowl, add egg and beat well. Combine flour and B. powder, add alternately with milk to creamed mixture. Pour over fruit. Add more milk if the batter is too stiff.

Bake at 350 for 50 - 60 minutes.

NOTE: Check to make sure the topping is cooked right through, it may take extra time.

Makes 12 servings
