Each of our actions impacts the lives of others. Life connects us like a web, and whether or not we like it, destruction connects us as well. The good God intends for us is constantly threatened by lifestyles of individualism and consumerism.

As a Christian Gunadule woman, I mourn the suffering of my indigenous brothers and sisters under the direct threat of a changing climate affecting their crops and food. I see them putting their lives at risk to defend the forests, waters and residents of our ancestral lands. These realities tear at my heart, because the injustice we cause to God’s creation is an injustice we commit against God and ourselves.

Jesus, forgive us for when our actions damaged your creation and its inhabitants. Give us greater awareness to understand the struggles faced by indigenous people. Help us to participate in your reconciling work. Amen.

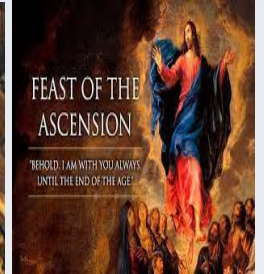

## Recommended book

### Confessions (Augustine)



The work is not a complete autobiography, as it was written during Saint Augustine's early 40s and he lived long afterwards, producing another important work, The City of God. Nonetheless, it does provide an unbroken record of his development of thought and is the most complete record of any single person from the 4th and 5th centuries. It is a significant theological work, featuring spiritual meditations and insights.

In the work, Augustine writes about how he regrets having led a sinful and immoral life. He discusses his regrets for following the Manichaeon religion and believing in astrology. He writes about his friend Nebridius's role in helping to persuade him that astrology was not only incorrect but evil, and Saint Ambrose's role in his conversion to Christianity. The first nine books are autobiographical and the last four are commentary and significantly more philosophical. He shows intense sorrow for his sexual sins and writes on the importance of sexual morality. The books were written as prayers to God, thus the title, based on the Psalms of David; and it begins with "For Thou hast made us for Thyself and our hearts are restless till they rest in Thee." The work is thought to be divisible into books which symbolize various aspects of the Trinity and trinitarian belief.

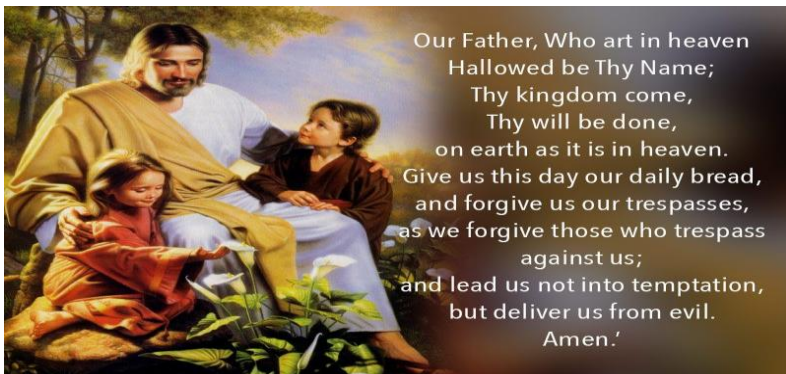

## History Corner



Constructed in 1844, the church sits in the middle of Vittoria's historic square and is flanked by the United Church (1845), Town Hall (1870) and Baptist Church (1853). This area provides a rare and valuable legacy of early architectural styles of Ontario – the most important being Christ Church. According to University of Toronto professor, Marion MacRae, OC, "of the timber churches which were designed in the continuing Georgian tradition, one of the handsomest yet standing is Christ Church, Vittoria."

The church is constructed entirely of wood, namely native Norfolk County pine. The structure, outside and in, displays a number of Regency characteristics, a style popular at the time. The exterior is clad with flush-boarding, beveled on either matching edge, and grooved to imitate the joints of masonry. The corners of the building are finished with heavier pieces of plank arranged to form cornerstones. The overall wood detail makes the church look like it has been constructed solely of carved stone. This particular characteristic is what makes the building so important. According to the Ontario Heritage Trust - Ministry of Tourism and Culture, the church is the last of its style from this period in all of Ontario and likely the entire country.

## TURKEY BREAST KIEV



### Ingredients

#### For the herb butter:

- 1 Tbsp fresh tarragon, chopped
- 4 Tbsp fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 Tbsp chives, chopped
- 1 Tbsp fresh lemon juice
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- ½ tsp ground black pepper
- 6 Tbsp butter, at room temperature

#### For the breading:

- 2 eggs, beaten
- ¾ cup flour
- 1 ½ cup panko
- ¾ cup vegetable oil (for cooking)

#### For the spinach:

- 1 tsp olive oil (for cooking)
- 2 cups fresh spinach, roughly cut

#### For the turkey:

- 2.25 lb turkey breast cut in 6 cutlets
- ½ tsp salt

### Instructions

#### For the herb butter:

1. In a bowl, put the chopped fresh herbs, lemon juice, garlic, pepper and butter. Mix all ingredients well using a fork.
2. Wrap the butter mixture in a plastic wrap and shape it into a roll about 1 inch thick. Put the herb butter in the freezer for at least 30 minutes.

#### For the spinach:

3. Heat olive oil in a skillet. Let the spinach wilt until the water has evaporated. Set aside and let cool.

#### For the turkey breast rolls:

4. Preheat the oven to 400F.
5. Insert the turkey breast cutlets between two sheets of parchment paper. Flatten the turkey using a meat mallet (or a rolling pin) until the cutlets are about 5 mm thick.
6. Season turkey pieces with salt.
7. Take the herb butter out of the freezer and cut in 6 equal parts.
8. Take one cutlet and fill with 1/6 of the spinach and 1 part of butter in the center. Roll the meat around the butter and the spinach, making sure sides are folded inside the roll. Secure roll with toothpicks. Repeat for each cutlet.
9. Put eggs, flour and panko in three separate bowls.
10. Coat each turkey roll with flour and shake off excess flour. Then, dip into the egg mix and coat with panko.
11. Heat vegetable oil in a skillet (about ½ inch thick). The amount of oil used could vary depending on the size of the skillet. Fry the turkey rolls for about 3 to 5 minutes on each side, until they start browning. Using baking tongs, turn rolls only one time during cooking to avoid piercing the rolls.
12. Once the rolls have browned, put on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper and cook in the oven for 20 minutes, or until turkey is fully cooked (see note).
13. Serve with mashed potatoes, rice, green vegetables or a salad!

**Notes:** You can check the doneness of the meat by inserting a meat thermometer in the turkey breast. The meat is cooked when it reaches an internal temperature of 165°F.
