

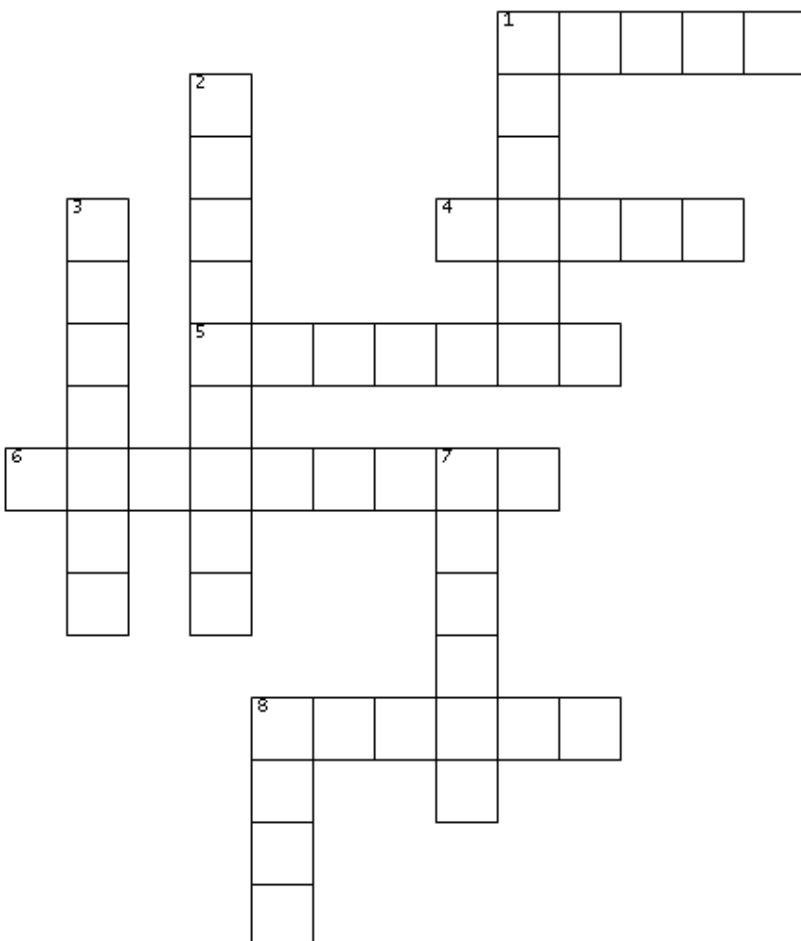

## Taste & See

### Strawberry and Cream Dessert



#### Ingredients

- 4 eggs
- 200 ml cream
- 10 strawberries
- 60 g (2 oz) sugar
- a pinch of gelatin
- 1 packet of vanillin
- 70 ml almond liqueur
- 60 g (2 oz) white chocolate

#### Instructions

Put white chocolate in a freezer for 10-15 minutes and then grate it. Pour water in a bowl and dissolve gelatin there.

Combine sugar, vanillin, liqueur, and yolks. Whip the mass with the help of a mixer.

Combine the gelatin with 3 tbsp of the prepared hard sauce. Then add the remaining hard sauce and put the mass in a fridge for half an hour.

Whip the cream until fluffy. Stir the hard sauce carefully. Add the grated chocolate and whipped cream. Mix the ingredients.

Put the prepared mass in serving bowls, cover them with parchment paper and place in a refrigerator for a couple of hours (it is better to put the dessert in a fridge for the whole night before serving).

Wash strawberries and cut them into 4 halves. Decorate the dessert with the strawberries and serve.

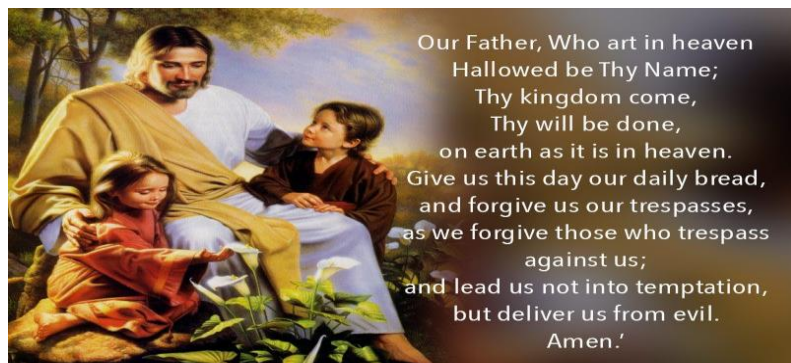
## WIND UPON THE WATERS



For the week beginning Sunday July 18, 2021, we will be praying for our Long Point Bay Parish, specially for our family of the church of Memorial Church Port Ryerse.

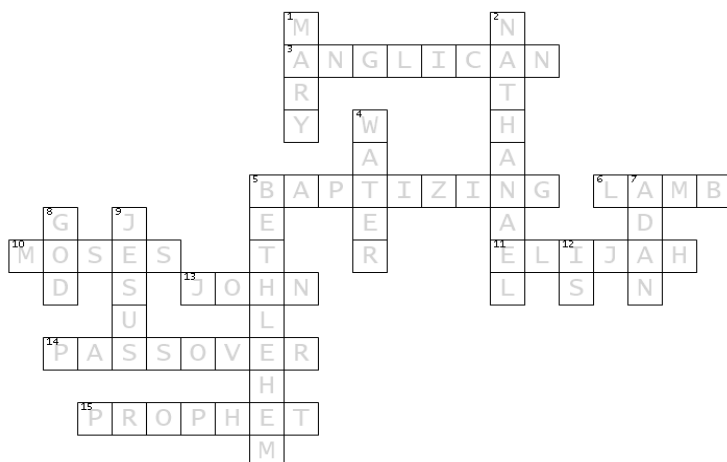

## OUR OUTREACH ON RWANDA #9

### Lines and Tales - from Rwanda-



Another place the 10 of us visited in 2007, was Lake Kivu, which is a lake between Rwanda and the Congo. Lake Kivu is labeled the Deadliest Lake in the World because of the amount of carbon dioxide and methane in the lower layers. It is a beautiful lake though, very much a paradise but with the off-chance of explosion or fire.

I see in May, there was a fire on the lake, as the gas escaped after an earthquake. (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RHMZsvJ8x0>)

Not only did we stop on our way to Lake Kivu, at the destroyed church mentioned before where so many died, we stopped at a bridge said to be over one source of the Nile, where young people played their homemade instruments hoping tourists would pay to hear their music.

We had lunch at a hotel-like establishment with a view of the lake. It took over an hour to get any food. Time for a cold drink though. It was off season and we were not expected but things are slower in Rwanda anyway. We then set out to find a refugee camp which took us up a very windy road with no barriers on the outer road-side as protection from a very steep fall. I also learned later; the condition of our vehicles' tires left a lot to be desired with little tread. It seemed like forever we travelled on that dirt road going higher and higher. Then in the distance, over the crest of a high hill we could see a cluster of substantial buildings with primitive circular mud huts on the outskirts of the fence that surrounded the camp. We were in 3 vehicles, stopped outside the gates and while our interpreters inquired about entry, we were swarmed by young children. As we had the windows down, one young boy with a ball made out of old paper and string struck up a conversation with my husband and commented on his fuzzy, hairy arm. We didn't get access to the camp but on leaving he touched my husband and said "Pray for me, Fuzzy Bob". As we surveyed our surroundings and the mud huts of his future, it was an emotional moment. My husband still tells this story when the memorable moments of our Rwanda visit are remembered and shared.

#### Events in history on that day

**64** – Great fire of Rome begins under the Emperor Nero

**1323** - Pope John XXII proclaims theologian Thomas Aquinas a saint in Avignon

**1872** - Voting by secret ballot was introduced for the first time in Britain by William Gladstone's Liberal government on this day. The House of Lords termed the idea as 'cowardly' and 'unmanly' and opposed it strongly.

**1877** - Thomas Alva Edison said 'Halloo' into the mouthpiece of a phonograph, while testing it and continued to use the word even later. The word eventually became the choice of telephone users worldwide for greeting. The word was derived from terms like hilla, halloa and hallo, used for calling out people from a distance.

**1932** - US and Canada sign a treaty to develop St. Lawrence Seaway

**1938** - Douglas "Wrong Way" Corrigan arrives in Ireland after a 28 hours flight supposedly left NY flying for California

**1976** - For her performance in the uneven parallel bars at the Olympic Games in Montreal, Nadia Comăneci of Romania became the first gymnast to be awarded a perfect score of 10 in an Olympic gymnastic event.
