

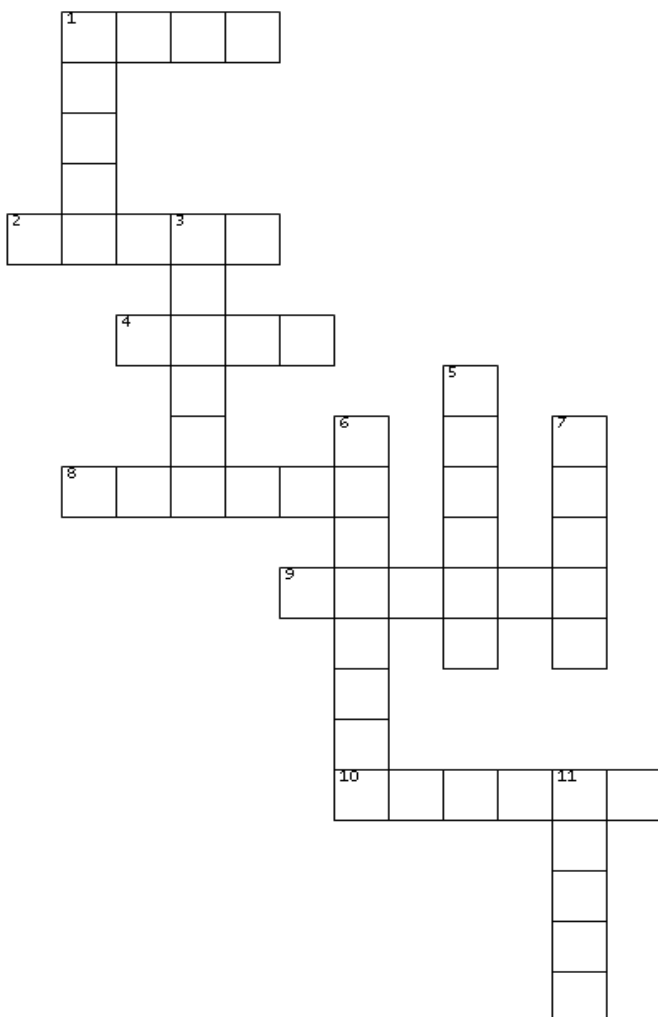

Strawberry Limeade



Ingredients

- 1/2 cup lime juice
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup water
- 1/2 lb sliced strawberries
- 20-30 mint leaves
- 2 cups cold water

Instructions

- ✓ To make the simple syrup, combine the sugar and water in a saucepan, and cook over medium high heat for 5-10 minutes until the sugar is dissolved and the liquid is clear.

He was also associate professor of contextual theology at Huron University College from 2011 to 2013. He was appointed dean in 2013.

The Brewmaster

Thus I sadly and with some "pressure" sadly closed down "The Belching Beaver Brewery." As a footnote, I should confess the rest of the story. Because I'd not been careful with the amount of sugar per bottle, those that remained tested in the range of 12 to 15% alcohol. My beer drinking buddies really loved that batch, but my assistant braufrau decided we would no longer be in the business - something about sticky floors and inebriated friends. Sometimes she just has no sense of humour!

In fact she threatened to name the paraphernalia I had bought, "paRaphERnalia"... I never knew this word, paraphernalia, until writing this column and being checked up by "spell checker".. Definition of paraphernalia - "the separate real or personal property of a married woman that by law she can legally dispose of without her husband's consent..."

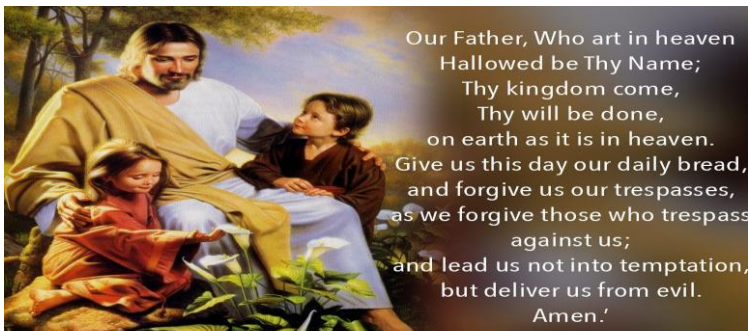

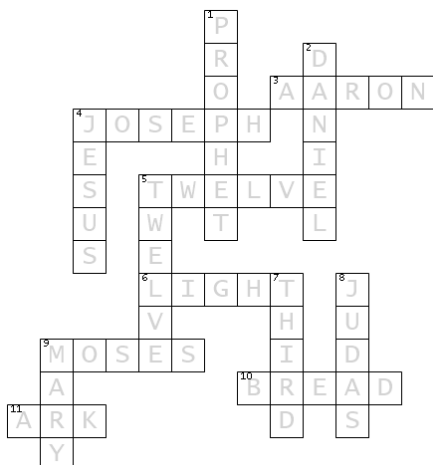

OUR OUTREACH ON RWANDA #11

Lines and Tales - from Rwanda-



In the beginning months of late 2007-2008 we created a committee of three, Tony Bouwmeester, Fred Carson and myself. Once the school was built which Fred oversaw in Rwanda and Tony and I took care of the administration and fund-raising in Canada, it was time to plan for the next stage. Tony and I felt we should continue to support the school because if they couldn't afford to build the school, how are they expected

Since it was a private school of the Anglican Diocese of Shyogwe there was no government money. It was situated in the most remote area and in a location of great poverty.

All the available people who had visited Rwanda and some who supported the project in some manner met in the church basement to help create the new Committee name, purpose and motto. With everyone's input we came up with Rwanda Education and Discovery Committee (READ Committee) and Hope and Understanding through Education as our motto.

We had a lot to learn. We couldn't directly send the money to Rwanda and we partnered with African Community Technical Services (ACTS) which I have mentioned in an earlier article. READ Committee over the years have averaged 5 members who originally met about every 6 weeks, with less meetings in the last few years. The committee was a diverse group of many interests, occupational and religious associations. We were under the umbrella of St John's Port Rowan and presently Memorial Church, Port Ryerse as a committee. We currently work with the Primate World Relief and Development Fund (PWRDF) with a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Diocese of Shyogwe, PWRDF and READ Committee to support the school. We have exited this past July 1st although the last funds are still to go. We are waiting for the narrative and financial reports from the school before we send more money which has always been our practice.

Where do we go from here? At this writing I don't know but by the end of my articles I hope to know more. I want to be able to tell you we have further funding, with another charitable organization taking over what the READ Committee, Memorial Church and I have been doing and the school will survive. Pray for this please.
