## Colombian Arepas

This is a quick and easy recipe to make delicious Colombian arepas. They are usually served for breakfast, as a side dish, or even for a quick meal.

### Step 1

Mix water, corn meal, mozzarella cheese, butter, and salt together in a large bowl. Knead until mixed well and the dough has a soft consistency. Form balls the size of a medium orange and place them between 2 sheets of plastic wrap. Flatten with a rolling pin to your desired thickness.

### Step 2

Cut the dough into circles using a cereal bowl or drinking glass, lip-down, through the plastic wrap. Remove the plastic wrap and remove excess dough.

### Step 3

Coat a griddle with cooking spray and heat to medium-high. Add arepas and grill until golden brown, about 5 minutes per side. Serve immediately.



### INGREDIENTS



- 1 cup warm water
- 1 cup pre-cooked white corn meal (such as P.A.N.®)
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 tablespoon butter
- ½ teaspoon salt, or to taste
- cooking spray

One thing I found about the Rwandan people was their ingenuity. I saw it first with the children as they collected scrape to create a useful item. From the young boy who collects scrape paper and string to produce a ball to toss around, to the creation of a drone system that carries medication and blood to remote areas. This drone company probably wasn't created by the Rwandans

but at this stage they managed and ran the whole operation. I did get a video of one coming back and being navigated to the home location.

I also came across a young person with a cart who collected old pieces of metal to make a skeleton of a cart. I shared this with the OPG staff, where I worked, in their newsletter and received a Nissan Micra wire frame design picture from an engineer employee which resembles what the young person created with scrap. There were also the very poor kids with rags for clothes and their toy was a stick with a wheel. I remember seeing this child-made toy in local Canadian pictures of 100 years ago. There was also the fellow with the pieces of wood scavenged, which he assembled to make a scooter. I would imagine the hardest thing to find would be wheels but they sometimes even form it out of wood.

Usually, they would have no internet or experiences to refer to for ideas. I always thought seeing these situations where they have used imagination to plan a goal and scoured the local environment to find just the right pieces to create their dream item, what could they accomplish with an education and proper resources, to go further with these creative minds. Remembrance Day is a memorial day observed in Commonwealth member states. Remembrance Day has been observed since the end of the First World War to remember armed forces members who have died in the line of duty.

Following a tradition inaugurated by King George V in 1919, the day is also marked by war remembrances in many non-Commonwealth countries. In most countries, Remembrance Day is observed on 11 November to recall the end of First World War hostilities. Hostilities formally ended "at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month" of 1918, in accordance with the armistice signed by representatives of Germany and the Entente between 5:12 and 5:20 that morning. The First World War officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles on 28 June 1919.
