

## CHRIST the KING



The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, Christ the King Sunday of Reign of Christ Sunday, is a relatively recent addition to the Western liturgical calendar. The Anglican, celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, which is contained in the Revised Common Lectionary; Churches often observe this as part of the liturgical season of Kingdomtide, which runs between the Fourth Sunday before Advent and the Feast of Christ the King. It is also observed on the same computed date as the final Sunday of the ecclesiastical year, the Sunday before the First Sunday of Advent. The earliest date on which it can occur is 20 November and the latest is 26 November.

### Cubanos Frijoles

#### Step 1

Place rice and water in a saucepan over medium heat. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to low and simmer for about 45 minutes, or until rice is tender.

#### Step 2

While the rice is cooking, brown the ground beef in a deep skillet or wok. Season with Cajun seasoning. When meat is almost done, add the onion, and cook until the meat is browned and the onion is translucent. Stir in the beans, olives, vinegar, and chipotle powder, if using. Mix well, cover, and simmer for 20 minutes over medium-low heat. Add the cilantro during the last 5 minutes of cooking. Serve hot over or mixed with rice.



### INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups brown rice
- 4 cups water
- 1 ½ pounds ground beef
- 2 tablespoons Cajun seasoning
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 (15 ounce) cans black beans
- 1 (6 ounce) can chopped black olives, drained
- ¼ cup red wine vinegar
- 3 sprigs fresh cilantro, chopped
- ¼ teaspoon ground dried chipotle pepper (Optional)

This Rwanda project involved a lot of different segments. One of these activities was the fund raising which was time consuming but what kept the school going, especially in the earlier years. There were presentations to create on PowerPoint, visits to schedule, people and organizations who showed an interest to contact and schedule a time to present.

There were activities necessary to bring some from Rwanda to explain first-hand the need and the positive affect Canadian funds were having on particularly the youth. Tony arranged all the paperwork to get our visitors over and different people contributed to where they stayed. People of the parish and friends kept them entertained when they weren't expressing thanks for our support at different venues. So many people did so many things to help during these times and I am sure some of you who are reading this are among those great people and we are very thankful as we couldn't have done it without you.

One fund raiser, Pete Post arranged through a CIBC community project, which financially supported the African Guitar Summit held at the Lighthouse Festival Theater in Port Dover. The Mighty Popo, originally from Rwanda, and other notable musicians from other African countries, performed for us. They left us dancing in the aisles. Another fund raiser which we repeated for several years, was a Road Rally, which Bob and I coordinated, along with many who helped in a multitude of ways. These events don't just happen because of one or two people but a host of people working together and giving their time and talents. I am very thankful for the READ committee, the Long Point Bay parishioners, neighbours and friends who were always willing to pitch in where needed. I am also thankful to Jack Beamer and Craig Combe who provided the event site, over the years. Other ways we obtained funds was through the Newsletter, individual donations and from the Blossom Foundation in Toronto that provided \$20,000 each year for seven years. We are very grateful for this support also. Special people made a decision to support a student in poverty at the school, which provided many poor young people an opportunity for "A Life". I don't have as much information about the dinner and backing from the Mennonite church as Tony arranged this but we were very thankful for this great support. Thanks, folks, for everything.
