

Opening

Reflection for Sunday March 13th 2022 from Rev Jack Cox

In our 1st reading this Sunday, Abram complains to God that God has not given Abram an heir and asks God if he should adopt one of the slaves of his house to be his heir. (That was the normal solution in such circumstances.) But God assures Abram that he will have a son of his own (from his own loins). That son will be his heir and Abram will have countless descendants (as many as the stars in the sky). God is literally promising old Abram endless descendants. God is basically promising Abram ‘immortality’ since Abram will live on and on in his endless descendants.

So, Abram then asks God how God can ensure him that this promise will really last – that God’s not just blowing smoke. What follows is what was called a Suzerainty covenant.

The Suzerain was the king and, in a ceremony, where the king made a covenant/bond with a subordinate, one or more animals were slaughtered, cut in half, and the pieces were laid opposite each other forming an aisle. The individual then making the promise pronounced the words of the covenant as he walked the aisle between the butchered parts of the animals – saying in effect: “May it be with me as the pieces of this carcass if I break this covenant!”

In this case, God walks the aisle and swears by God’s own self that the promise he has made to Abram will not be broken. Abram’s name is then changed to Av Raham (Father of Many).

The really incredible thing here is that God offers God’s own self as assurance of the faithfulness of the promise. God, not Abram, walks that aisle between the body parts.

On Mar 4 of this year, I turned 80 (my god! that’s ancient!) Have God and I made serious covenants over those 80 years? Absolutely! - Lots! Did God ever break his part? Never! Did I ever break my part? I think that would depend on who you asked. For my part, I would say “No!” But along the way we’ve renegotiated the terms of the covenant.

My experience is that covenants, promises, are living things and living things change. Sometimes those living promises change and we need to change to continue to be true to the promises we made. Marriage is probably as good an example as I can think of. We make promises on our wedding day and as life throws its curves at us things/we change and we adapt. When we marry, we make promises to our spouse. Over the years we change, our spouse changes so we adapt. Nothing stays the same.

Contrary to what some people think, change is not a bad thing. But I do think we need to look carefully at our lives, where we’ve come from and where we’re going and to decide what changes, if any, we need to make to get from here to there! Just so we can keep those promises we made to ourselves and to others.

What is most interesting to me in this covenant between God and Abram is that God offers God’s own self as the assurance of promise!

In my life’s travels, negotiations, ‘bargaining’ with God, God has always been there with me. God has always been the guide to get me where I needed to go, even when I didn’t see it or understand it and even when I wasn’t getting it ‘right’. Did I always see it or understand it at the time? No!

But 8 decades down the road, the path is clearer, and the one who stuck with me through it all is closer to me now than my own breath! And I have a greater understanding of and appreciation for Abram, a fellow traveler.
